Around 50 students of Pali Medical College fell ill due to food poisoning on Thursday morning. They were first attended in the college itself but were shifted to Bangar Hospital, where about a dozen were admitted for observation.

Principal Deepak Verma said by evening, all students were discharged after keeping them under observation for the entire day.

“Most of them reported stomach ache and loose motions but those few, who vomited and had diarrhea, had been admitted for observation”, said Verma.

According to information, a freshers party had been organised at the medical college on Wednesday evening and around 300 students had attended the party.

“A feast had been organised by senior students for the juniors on Wednesday night. Meal had been provided by a local caterer. The meal also contained a sweet item made of milk, which seemed to have caused food poisoning in some students”, said Verma.

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Over 50 students reported symptoms like stomachache, nausea and vomiting etc. They were first treated at the medical college itself. But they were taken to the trauma center of Bangar Hospital for proper attendance.

“Most of them, however, were discharged after primary treatment but about a dozen of those, who had symptoms like diarrhea and vomiting were decided to be admitted for observation”, Verma said.

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
