

After the dreaded Lumpy Skin disease, glander disease has started to attack horses in the state. In Bathinda district, one horse has died due to Glandar disease while samples of three horses have been found positive. Before this, two horses have died under suspicious circumstances in Bhakta Bhaika. The district administration has become alert after the death of a horse suffering from glanders disease in Lehra Mohabbat village of the district. To prevent the further spread of this disease, District Magistrate Shaukat Ahmed Pare has issued orders to completely stop the movement of horses within a radius of 25 km of Lehra Mohabbat.

According to the information received, three horses of the horse breeder of Lehra Mohabbat were sick, according to the department, whose samples were reported positive. After this, the team of the animal husbandry department tried to kill the horses by injecting them, but due to the opposition of the horse breeders and people, the department could not do this. Now the horse has died due to the said disease, which has been buried by the doctors of animal husbandry department wearing PPE kits. According to the animal husbandry department, symptoms of glanders have been found in three mares in village Lehra Mohabbat.
